







Colon cancer screenings save lives.

It is important that you and your family have routine annual physicals, including cancer and other screenings.

Remember that your annual check-up is covered at 100% when you see an in-network provider. During your annual check-up, talk with your provider about when you should get a colon cancer screening.

Screening for colorectal cancer is recommended for men and women beginning at age 50*. National guidelines for colorectal cancer screening include several screening test options.

Ask your provider

- What screening test(s) do you recommend for me and why?
- How do I prepare? Do I need to change my diet or my usual medication before taking the test?
- What's involved in the test? Will there be any discomfort?
- What are the risks involved?
- > When and from whom will I get results?

If you're having a colonoscopy or sigmoidoscopy, you will want to know:

- Who will do the exam?
- Will I need someone with me?

Your SAMBA plan may cover your colon cancer screening at 100% when you visit an in-network provider. Covered tests include:

- > Fecal occult blood test for members age 40 and older
- Sigmoidoscopy screening every five years, starting at age 50
- Routine screening colonoscopy every 10 years, starting at age 50, including facility and anesthesia charges related to the colonoscopy exam

Most people know that tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke cause lung cancer. But there are many other health consequences as well.

- Increased risk of many types of cancer
- More frequent colds and chronic bronchitis
- Emphysema
- High blood pressure
- Stroke
- Heart disease
- Tooth decay

Quitting tobacco is one of the best things you can do for your health. However, behavior change is rarely a single event. It is a process with stages people pass through.

What about e-cigarettes?

Scientists still have a lot to learn about whether e-cigarettes are effective for quitting smoking. The long-term health impact of using them isn't known. E-cigarettes can contain harmful substances, including cancer-causing chemicals and heavy metals such as nickel, tin and lead.*
