

In response to the current conditions related to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the need to limit the spread of the virus while maintaining access to care, we have *temporarily* expanded our telemedicine benefit. Since March 16, 2020, SAMBA members and their dependents have been able to receive telehealth services, including office visits, mental health counseling and preventative health screenings, conducted by providers such as: physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, clinical psychologists, and clinical social workers. Normal copay, coinsurance and deductible amounts are applied to these services. Additionally, SAMBA continues to offer coverage for telemedicine visits through Teladoc providers. For COVID-19 diagnostic testing, SAMBA will waive member costs for the testing and associated medical visit when the testing is ordered by a doctor or other health care provider.

This temporary benefit expansion will be in place for the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Please check SAMBA's web site www.SambaPlans.com for any additional changes to regular benefits.

For members and dependents with Medicare Part B coverage, lab tests for COVID-19 are covered with no out-of-pocket costs when it is ordered by a doctor or other health care provider that accepts Medicare. Medicare has also temporarily expanded its coverage of <u>telehealth services</u> to ensure patients are able to visit with their doctors from their homes, without having to go to a doctor's office or hospital, which could put the patients and others at risk of exposure to COVID-19.

Currently there is no known treatment for COVID-19 beyond treating the symptoms of the disease. Patients who get seriously ill from the virus may need a variety of inpatient and outpatient services. Normal copay, coinsurance and deductible amounts would apply to these services.
